### HUMANITIES TENNESSEE ASSESSMENT

On Saturday, March 16, Mr. Rob DeHart performed an evaluation of the present operation of the Bemis Mill Village Museum and an assessment of the potential value of our venture for society at large. Mr. DeHart is one of the curators of the Tennessee State Museum in Nashville, but was acting as a consultant for Humanities Tennessee (HT) in performing the assessment. The purpose of the assessment, and hopefully the end result, was to determine if we qualified for the monetary grants, professional help and guidance resources offered by HT.

Mr. DeHart met first with our Board and other active volunteers to familiarize himself with the specific details of our activities and to hear of our wants and needs for the future. A guided tour of Bemis was given to Mr. DeHart by Joel Jackson. After the tour, many of our other loyal BHS members, other citizens and elected officials, met with Mr. DeHart to provide even more excellent input and ideas. After all meetings, Mr. DeHart reported that he was quite favorably impressed with Bemis, our people and our museum operation.

In April, Mr. DeHart will provide a written report of his findings and recommendations to HT. Upon HT's acceptance and approval of the report and recommendations, our museum would immediately qualify to make application for grants and other HT resources. Thanks so much to all who participated in these meetings and who have contributed in the past to getting us this recognition.

# BEMIS HORIZONS ENDOWMENT FUND:

Planning for our Museum's Future

Our Society wants to ensure that the Bemis Mill Village Museum will be open and available to serve the community for many years to come. To make that goal a reality, the **Bemis Horizons Endowment Fund** was started several years ago at the West Tennessee Healthcare Foundation. Current projections are that once the museum

opens, a minimum of \$13,000 annually will be needed just to keep the doors open (maintenance, utilities, etc.)
