### Permanent Bemis Mill Landmark Planned

After many months of negotiations and a search to find potential investors to save the Bemis Mill, its deconstruction is underway. A valiant effort was made by city officials, including Mayor Jerry Gist and Councilwoman Vicky Foote, to save the structure, but in the end the mill's size and condition were too much to overcome in finding investors. It was estimated that it would cost \$6-\$8 million to bring the building up to code, and another \$500,000 to \$700,000 to put a new roof on the mill, according to the current mill owner.

The mill was built in 1900 and has been vacant since 1993. Only the mill itself will be deconstructed, not the surrounding buildings.

Plans are being made to place a landmark park on the two acre lot where the mill stands. Christian Morton, current mill owner, has been reported to have agreed to donate 20,000 bricks from the mill to be used in the construction of the park. According to *The Jackson Sun*, "The bricks will be used to build two 20-foot towers with a 10-foot high wall that will display the history of the mill and its significance in the Bemis community, in South Jackson."

The park, provided by the city of Jackson, will have the city's first splash pad for children. Benches will be provided and possibly a picnic tables, but plans are still under development. The city will provide a camera directly connected

to police dispatch for security at the park, as well as lighting.

### **Museum Committee Update**

Considerable work was completed prior to Bemis days refining many exhibits throughout the museum. Recently our Museum Committee's primary focus has been to complete the Technology and the Bemis Mill Exhibit with the direction and financial support of a grant from Humanities Tennessee.

In the first meeting with Rob DeHart, our exhibit design consultant from Nashville, the group collectively established an outline and potential exhibit area layout for the story featuring the "cutting edge" technology that was present in Bemis. We intend to professionally communicate that interesting and significant part of our Bemis story to the museum visitors.

Some basic exhibit components were established and individuals were assigned the task of developing narratives for each component. Mr. DeHart has refined and returned the narratives to the committee for their review. Graphic images and artifacts to complement the narratives are being selected. Another meeting of the committee will convene after our reviews and feedback is complete, probably mid-autumn.


