## Chairman's Update

Here we are in a new year, 2008. Since the last newsletter we have had the Fish Fry fundraiser sponsored by the South Side Optimist Club. Roy Neal Mitchell and Troy Sullivan were the ramrods, but the whole bunch pitched in to help. It was delicious. I know Roy's secret but I'm not telling. Along with the Optimists, Society members did a lot of work too. Many gallons of white beans were cooked by different people. I sampled five or six and they were all good. Our ladies baked a bunch of cakes and they filled two long tables. No one left hungry. A few plates were delivered to folks who couldn't get out. We netted just over \$1,600 on the event.

We have once again applied for a \$40,000 Tennessee Historical Commission grant and hope to hear from the Commission in a few weeks. Our partners, Jackson Energy Authority, have paid their third \$13,000 installment on the sponsorship of the Technology and the Bemis Mill Exhibit for our museum. This will be the main exhibit in the museum, and rightly so.

We have been in contact with Scott Bemis of Minneapolis who has helped us with a lot of archived information about the Company and our village. Don Bemis has donated artifacts and provided us with a genealogical printout of the Bemis family. Most recently Damon Becker of Orinda, CA, has found us. He is the great, great grandson of Judson Moss Bemis. All of these Bemis people are excited about our Society and the future Bemis Mill Village Museum. I hope we

can make them proud. Another contact is Lee Droll, a former Director of Operations with Bemis in St. Louis. He is now in Naples, FL, and has the big bronze "Bemis Mill Office" sign which was on the front of the office for many years. He is donating it within the next few days. That will make a fine centerpiece for an exhibit. Bobbye Trammell of Bemiston, AL, found us and is interested in swapping Bemis information. She is in the process of writing a book on Bemiston.

Locally we have a good chance of getting historical street lights. Ones with the globe at the top, like those that were in New Town. For you folks out of town, I hate to tell you, but the floor is still unfinished. If the Tennessee Historical Commission grant comes through, the floors will be refinished. On Wednesday, Jan. 16<sup>th</sup>, the excess roof tiles left Bemis on two flatbed trucks - sold to a buyer in Rockford, IL. Maybe we can locate the buyer who gets them and give them their history.

Plan now to attend the Bemis Days Celebration, Friday night May 16<sup>th</sup> and Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup>. A number of Classes are planning reunions so a lot of folks will be here. If you are local, don't forget to mark your calendar for the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 P.M. for the monthly meeting of the Bemis Historical Society at the historic Bemis United Methodist Church. Hope to see you there!
